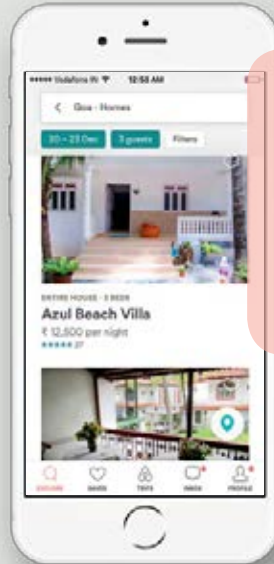

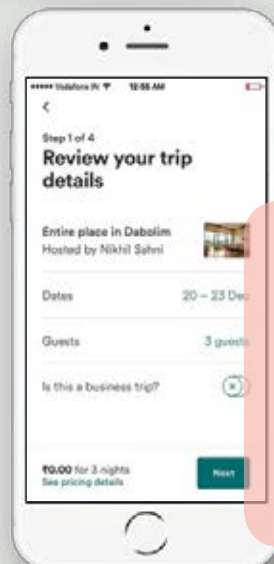

Located in the quaint village of Siolim and surrounded by the most happening places of North Goa, Villa Solitude offers the best of two worlds.

Villa Solitude, in the village of Siolim, North Goa, is a postcard home for your holiday in Goa. The blue and white façade in traditional Goan architecture coupled with lush surroundings gives the impression of a home-away-from-home.

Siolim lies on the banks of River Chapora, close to Vagator, Morjim, Ashwem, and Anjuna. It is one of the most pristine and untouched villages of Goa that has not changed itself for tourists.

Ensnconed in lush greenery, the four-bedroom villa stands tall in the gated community, Villa Goesa. It has some beautiful walking and cycling trails and popular landmarks St Anthony's Church and San Joao Chapel just minutes away.

For an evening with friends, you can drive down to Baga and Anjuna, or attend the Saturday Night Market in Arpora to get a feel of the Bohemian vibe of Goa. If you are looking for more, let the hosts and caretakers of the villa, Ruth and Wilbert, help chart out an itinerary to experience the village like a local.

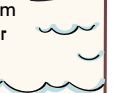

The Vintage Life

Relive Goa's Portuguese history at one of the most stylish residential areas in the state.

Tucked away in the charming town of Assagao in North Goa is a historic 200-year-old Indo-Portuguese mansion that has been restored and thrown open to travellers seeking a refuge in nature.

The Villa, spread over one-and-a-half acres of manicured gardens, has two options up for rental—a restored mansion, The Villa Goa and a renovated villa, Villa Jardim. It is owned and run by Mark Bell, a Briton who travelled the world but decided to build his dream

home in Goa.

Located close to Anjuna and Vagator, it gives you ample opportunity to divide time between sunning on the beach and enjoying the exclusivity of the luxurious villa. (The host rents out the villa to only one group or family at a time, giving the occupants exclusive access to the entire property.)

For some quiet time, take a walk through the verdant garden with its palm trees and shrubs and relax with the sounds of nature.

EXPERIENCE

Set around the traditional open courtyard, the rooms and dining areas of The Villa Goa honour the rich legacy of their former Portuguese occupants. Dine by a burbling fountain in the courtyard as the in-house European chef serves up your favourite dishes. The villa also has Gregory Bazire—who has collaborated with several Michelin-starred restaurants across the world—on board on special occasions to offer a memorable dining experience to guests. Meanwhile, the two-bedroom Villa Jardim has a sub-tropical jungle garden in its backyard. THE SPACE

The house has been renovated with luxurious essentials, yet it manages to maintain its rustic charm. From antique artefacts in the living room to vintage beds in the suites, the house is peppered with elements reminiscent of the lives of its earlier occupants.

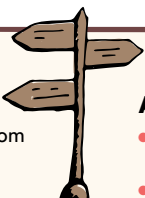

Summertime Ease

Follow the sounds of nature at Summertime, a palatial villa located a stone's throw away from Calangute and Candolim beaches.

Set in two acres of landscaped gardens on a hilltop in Calangute, Summertime is a plush three-suite villa that has an intimate charm that appeals to you from the moment you walk in.

Owned by Dutch-Indian couple Hans Tuinman and Sucheta Potnis, Summertime was awarded Asia's Most Romantic Boutique Retreat 2016 by the World Boutique Hotel Awards.

It is located in a quiet, forested area not far from Calangute and Candolim beaches, and has three master suites, an infinity pool, a

lounge pool, a koi pond, and a waterfall. A private luxury yacht, Solita, is at your service; the owners are happy to recommend cruising itineraries if you want to take it for a spin.

Inside, the double height living-dining area has floor-to-ceiling glass doors that fill the common space with light and offer panoramic views of the lush greenery around the property. The interiors—furniture sourced from Bali and throughout India and the retro Hunter fans—are all hues and warmer shades of red and orange.

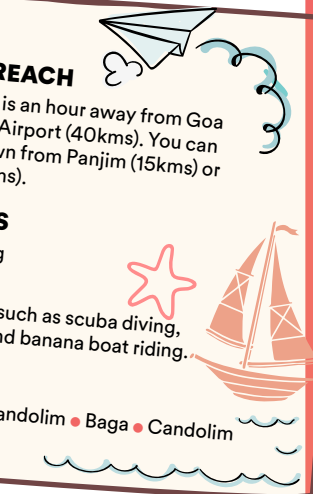

Wake up to the chirping of birds or watch the koi in the pond from the generous **Koi Suite**. The **Coral Suite** which faces the infinity pool and the valley is the most romantic of all the suites. The interiors are done in shades of reds, pink, and white with a four-poster bed the central character of the room. Steeped in History

The Figueiredo family was granted a coat of arms by the King of Portugal in the 19th century.

A long-standing Goan-Portuguese family has opened the door of their mansion, Figueiredo Heritage Inn, for discerning travellers tracing Goa's history.

The Figueiredo Heritage Inn, in the heart of Loutolim, was home to one of the most influential families of Goa for more than 400 years. It is now an Airbnb ideal for travellers looking for more than just a museum visit to learn about the history of Goa.

The mansion—which predates the Taj Mahal—still houses members of the Figueiredo family. The house is steeped in history—the floor tiles imported from Italy,

chandeliers and sconces made from Belgian crystal, porcelain sourced from China and Japan, and leather-upholstered chairs from Portugal. Every corner of the house tells a tale of yesteryear.

A section of the house has been converted into a museum which remains open all week. The current owner, Maria de Lourdes Figueiredo de Albuquerque, takes visitors on a private tour to give an insider's account of the days of the Portuguese Raj.



THE FIGUEIREDOS

The Figueiredos were Saraswat Brahmins who moved base to Loutolim and embraced Christianity. They were a much celebrated family during the time of the Portuguese Raj. While Vicente João de Figueiredo was a member of the Portuguese Legislative Assembly, Georgina Natália Filomena de Figueiredo became the first female judge of India. The current owner of the mansion, Maria de Lourdes Figueiredo de Albuquerque, was the first and youngest female member of the Portuguese Parliament.

ROOMS AND SUITES

Besides the family suite, there are three bedrooms in the house, each named after illustrious women who lived here—Amalia Double, Georgina Twin, and Elsa Twin. However, the highlights of the property are the garden courtyard, the sun deck, and an envious library that boasts a rare collection of books. Book this Home at:

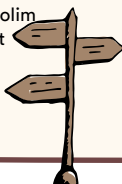

Eccentric Beauty

A boutique villa in an unhurried village of Goa, Zoloft is an intimate boho chic space for city-dwellers.

Assagao in North Goa is home to several hidden gems. Take the Dosso Zor spring, for example, which is believed to have healing properties and a pillar called Kator, a symbol of the region's Hindu past. A walk past the popular Anjuna and Vagator beaches takes you to Zoloft, a beautiful villa with fascinating artworks, plush sofas and rugs, and comfortable arm chairs that evoke the feeling that you are in a home away from home. Created by a team of acclaimed international designers, Zoloft is a stress buster villa for those who want to leave the city behind. As

you enter, you are greeted by manicured gardens, a private swimming pool, and a pillared verandah.

The traditional thatched roof, combined with a carpet of green, and a row of palms surrounding the four-bedroom villa make it a postcard destination for a vacay in Goa.

There is a lesser known beach, Gudem, just around the corner. Ask the host Jeh to help rent a bike or car to explore the village and adjoining areas.

You can also drive down to the party capitals of Anjuna and Baga, just 10 minutes away, or try your luck at the offshore Casino Palace and Casino Pride.

THE SPACE

The city is far from your thoughts when you are sitting in the terrace that looks straight into the eyes of the forest. You are at home here—fix up a meal for you and your partner in the kitchen, take your conversation to the living room where you can lounge on the sofa or get comfy in the distinctive yellow arm chairs. The antique lighting of the home, its blue grey windows, and tiles and patterns add to the inviting vibe.

In each of its four bedrooms you will also notice fun decor—each is colour-coded—with minimalist elements that make the space cosy and warm. 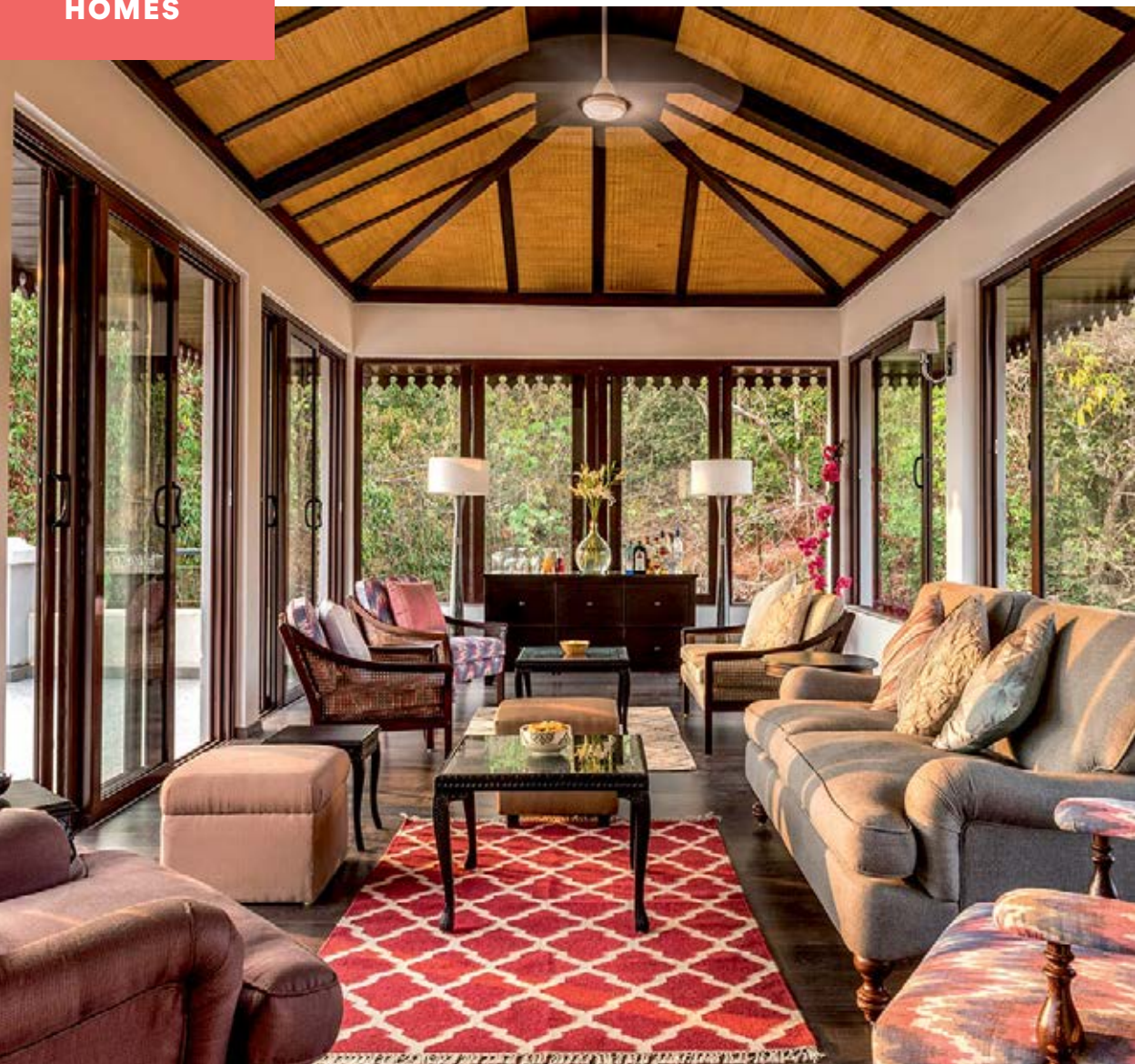

Spread across three sprawling floors, Casa Sol is a dream home with a summerhouse feel that allows in swathes of gorgeous Goan sunlight, but also affords you the most magnificent views of the countryside.

This four-bedroom luxury villa is close enough to all the action of Candolim, but still tucked away enough for those who prefer the slightly quieter life. Perched close to the flowing banks of the river Nerul and surrounded by a

thriving woodland, Casa Sol offers great outside spaces to both dine and drink in nature.

As the villa comes equipped with its very own caretaker-cum-cook, you will have plenty of time to chill while they rustle up

something local—courtesy of the villa's fully laden kitchen—for you and your guests.

If that's too much effort, then there's a raft of local eateries a stone's throw away offering Goan classics like Vindaloo or banana fry.

Goa is all set to get its first museum of fashion, **Moda Goa Museum**, next year. Wendell Rodricks, the man who put Goa on the world fashion map, is converting his much loved 450-year-old villa, Casa Dona Maria, in Colvale to an abode of fashion that traces the costume history of Goa. "I have been collecting objects for the last 17 years; the entire collection will go on display," says the iconic designer who shifted base to his hometown two decades ago. As one of the famous residents of the state, Wendell picks his favourites when it comes to fashion and lifestyle in Goa.

A luxury vagabond, Mark Bell was a Bengaluru-based retail designer until he could not resist the easy-going Goan lifestyle any longer. A quick decision and some more research later, the Londoner found himself standing in front of a 200-year-old Portuguese villa that was in complete ruins—broken doors and shutters, collapsed walls, and screeching bats as guests.

With years of experience in architecture and designing, Mark got down to rebuilding every single corner of the house himself. Almost a decade later, Mark hosts travellers from across the world at The Villa in Assagao where he fascinates guests with his travel stories from Hong Kong, Bangkok, Singapore, and many more places.

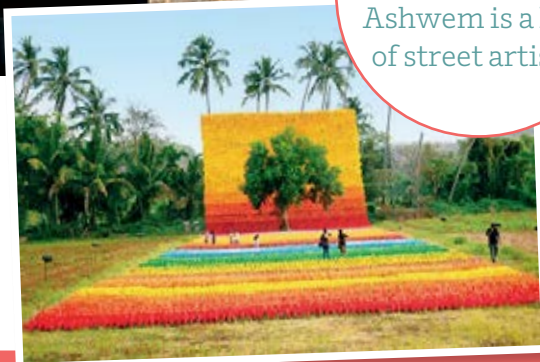

On *ghumat*, a percussion instrument.

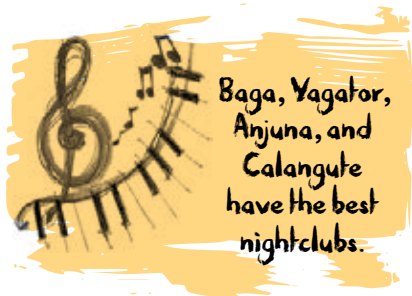
MUST-HAVE MUSICAL EXPERIENCE
